Mission 66: Initiated in 1956, Mission 66 was created in response to the overwhelming use of National Parks following World War II. This 10 year program, sought to accommodate larger crowds and provide visitors with the same basic amenities wherever they traveled. Colter Bay Village was a pilot project for Mission 66, John D. Rockefeller, Jr. and associates built many of the visitor service structures including a small general store, gas station, boat marina, restaurants, and the very first recreational vehicle (RV) campground in a national park. Historic log cabins from abandoned dude ranches throughout the valley were moved to the site and placed among the trees creating the cabin village. The successful completion of these developments as well as Park projects including the first Mission 66 visitor center, an amphitheater, and campground encouraged the National Park Service to expand the Mission 66 program nationally.
